PepsiCo and the IDB Improve Nutrition for LAC's Little Ones



On the eve of World Food Day, long time partners PepsiCo Chairman & CEO Indra Nooyi and Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) President Luis Alberto Moreno gathered to unveil the Spoon Project. A groundbreaking nutrition project made possible by a \$5 million grant from PepsiCo, Spoon will work to simultaneously prevent undernutrition and reduce the risk of obesity in babies living in poor areas of Colombia, Guatemala, Mexico and Peru. Paradoxically interrelated conditions, this marks the first instance both have been targeted by a single intervention, marking a leap toward innovative solutions to the region's complex nutritional challenges. CEO Nooyi and President Moreno were joined by health authorities from participating countries and partner organizations, including technical advisors the Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN) and Nutriset, at the event.

Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and Other Partners Inspire through Grand Challenges Canada

Today, as many as 200 million children fail to reach their full developmental potential. This is a devastating waste of human capital that contributes to global poverty, and that inspired the **Government of Canada** to launch its <u>Saving Brains Grand Challenge</u>. An initiative created with such valued IDB partners as the <u>Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation</u>, the partnership fosters and improves bold ideas for improving the early brain development of infants and children in low-resource countries.

Yet this is not the only effort pursued by Grand Challenges Canada. In late September, as part of UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon's launched <u>'Every Woman, Every Child'</u> initiative, the

partnership announced \$2.4 million in grants for 22 bold ideas to address this challenge. Additionally, Grand Challenges invites applications for three new Grand Challenges:

- Putting Women and Girls at the Center of Development
- Creating and Measuring Integrated Solutions for Healthy Birth, Growth, and Development (part of the All Children Thriving platform)
- New Interventions for Global Health

Applications for these new challenges will be accepted beginning on November 4, 2014.

Niñas Viviendo con Altura Proves the Power of Empowering Girls through Sports



Niñas Viviendo con Altura, a unique program that empowers girls traditionally denied access to sports, reached 670 girls between 12 and 18 years of age in El Alto, Bolivia. Using a sports for development methodology, these girls were taught about leadership, communication, self-esteem and violence prevention, while their community as a whole was engaged on the topics of gender equality and the power of sports as a tool for personal development. Partners Fundación Estás Vivo, Baisa (Club Bolivar), Fundación Alalay, Brightstar, Save the Children, the Bolivian Ministry of Public Works, Services and Housing, the Bolivian Viceministry of Housing and Urbanism, and the IDB gathered to make this program possible, and together helped inspire positive change in this community 4,100 meters above sea level.

Could it Be? IDB EYE Bond Regarded the "First Genuine Supranational Social Bond Issue"

An IDB-issued bond is raising eyebrows in the world of social investment—but in a good way. The triple-A rated, four-year Education, Youth, and Employment (EYE) bond will make loans to improve the quality of education and enhance the skills of young people entering LAC's job market. Supported by purchases from 24 investors, the US\$500-million issuance marked the launch of the EYE Bond program, which Threadneedle UK deemed "the first genuine first genuine supranational Social Bond issue." Threadneedle went on to say that the IDB's EYE Bond could well lead to similar issuances former entities, similar to the ripple effect seen in the development of Green Bonds..

The Sabin-IDB Alliance Partners for Results, Proving Integrated NTD Solutions are Possible



For five years, a strong partnership between **Sabin** and the IDB has worked toward an integrated approach to Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTDs), to which hundreds of millions of people in Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC) are still at risk. In September, they proved that it can be done! Through "It Can be Done: An Integrated Approach for Controlling and Eliminating Neglected Tropical Diseases," they took another step toward reversing the tendency toward underfunded, isolated efforts against these diseases, proving the value and viability of comprehensive approaches to fighting them instead.

Water is essential to life, so shouldn't we watch how we use it? The PepsiCo Foundation and the IDB think so, as proved by their unveiling of Hydro-BID during this year's World Water Week. An integrated suite of water resource modelling tools meant to empower decision makers, Hydro-BID allows for better prediction of water supply shortfalls and more informed decisions about water allocation, among other things. A product of the IDB-managed AquaFund, it is currently being piloted in Argentina, Haiti, and Peru, and is expected to impact more than three million people across the LAC region by 2017.

The Salud Mesoamerica 2015 Partnership Starts Celebrating Results



After 18 months of work, <u>El Salvador</u> and <u>Honduras</u> have reached the ambitious health goals set for the first wave of **Salud Mesoamerica** 2015 (SM2015) operations. The SM2015 Initiative is an innovative public-private partnership created to reduce health equity gaps in Central-America and the Mexican State of Chiapas. Thanks to funding and visionary guidance from the **Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation**, **Carlos Slim Foundation**, and the **Government of Spain**, services in the countries have been improved in the form of new nutrition standards, capacity building in health units, increased supplies for obstetric and neonatal care, and more. So far, El Salvador and Honduras have received a combined amount of over \$3.5 million as recognition for achieving these results and as a means for continued improvement. The Initiative's remaining countries are also being evaluated by the external and independent organization as they work to improve the lives of women and children.

Spain's "La Caixa" Foundation Takes Partnership a Step Further Through Corporate Volunteers



To top off a 2013 contribution from its Foundation to two social entrepreneurship projects in Ecuador, Spain's "La Caixa" Foundation took partnership a step further this year through its corporate volunteers program, CooperantesCaixa. Intended to enhance its joint efforts with the IDB in the country, four CaixaBank employees took to the field for almost a month to share better management practices and help upgrade systems in a cocoa small farmers cooperative. Santiago Valdiviezo of *Maquita Cushunchic Comercializando como Hermanos* (MCCH), the organization that received the volunteers, shared that "the contributions of our "La Caixa" peers made improvements... that will strengthen the management of the community center". In this way, the partners managed their shared goal of promoting social equity and economic development.



From Tokyo to CGI, the IDB Emphasizes the Need to Empower LAC's Women



A Tokyo event organized by ASI and the Embassy of El Salvador in Japan gathered more than 100 people to showcase Ciudad Mujer, a project of **the Government of El Salvador**. The seminar revealed the impact an integrated combination of participatory citizenship, financial independence, and learning one's rights can have on the lives of women in the region. The keynote speaker, El Salvador's Secretary of Social Inclusion Dr. Vanda Guiomar Pignato, shared the podium with Japan's Minister for Gender Equality Ms. Masako Mori and her predecessor Ms. Kuniko Inoguchi. Additionally, IDB President Moreno participated in the Girls & Women Strategy Session at **the Clinton Global Initiative**. Joined by Melanne Verveer of **Georgetown University**, Michael Goltzman of **The Coca-Cola Company**, Tim Hanstad of Landesa, and Kennedy Odede of Shining Hope for Communities, President Moreno remarked that when it comes to empowering girls and women, "we are just scratching the surface."

In line with the IDB's overarching goal to position Latin America as a breadbasket for worsening global food insecurity, Kolfaci will work to improve the socioeconomic status of small-scale farmers, establish a network of Latin American countries, develop nutrition and dietary improvement programs, and more.
