## Germany and the IDB Enter a New Decade of Partnership



In Berlin this Friday, President Luis Alberto Moreno of the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) joined Hans-Joachim Fuchtel, German Governor and Parliamentary State Secretary to <a href="telegraph">the Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ)</a>, to renew the Germany-IDB partnership agreement for an additional ten years. A partnership critical to driving the IDB's climate change and green growth agenda, the partners have already accomplished much, pioneering projects such as the first Concentrated Solar Power plant in Latin America, and generating knowledge to help mainstream green topics within IDB operations. Ranking as the top contributor to the Bank's Sustainable Energy and Climate Change Initiative and a driver of innovative, out-of-the-box climate and environment-focused solutions, an upcoming IDB publication will tell the story of the region's longstanding relationship with its European counterpart, and will soon be available at <a href="https://www.iadb.org/partnerships">www.iadb.org/partnerships</a>. Demand Solutions 2.0 Once Again Sparks Innovation at the IDB



The IDB once again partnered with **the Blum Centers at UC Berkeley and UCLA** to host the second edition of Demand Solutions: Ideas for Improving Quality of Life. A one-day event showcasing some of the world's most creative minds, Demand Solutions has become a platform for discussing and fostering innovation, as well as networking with entrepreneurs, development professionals, and other likeminded individuals. The 2014 event ended with a Venture Night, where some of the most disruptive startups established by LAC's young entrepreneurs pitched their ideas. Named LAC's Most Innovative Startup, Victoria Alonsoperez's Uruguay-based Chipsafer won a US\$30,000 prize from the IDB and **MasterCard** to expand this platform for tracking the location and health of cattle herds. Other winners came from Argentina, Brazil, Colombia, and Guatemala.

# It's Getting Hot, Hot, Hot: KfW and BMZ Bring Geothermal Electricity to Latin America



KfW Development Bank, by order of the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ), launched the first climate initiative for geothermal energy for Latin America. Unveiled at the UN Climate Change Conference, the EUR €760 million Facility supports the preparation and construction of geothermal power plants in ten Latin American countries. The Facility also counts on the collaboration of the IDB and several of its partners, including the Agence Française de Développement, the CAF, the European Investment Bank, the Japan International Cooperation Agency, and the World Bank.

Going Global: the European Investment Bank and the IDB Partner for SME Internationalization



This fall, **European Investment Bank (EIB)** President Werner Hoyer and IDB President Moreno signed in a joint effort to support the internationalization of European and Latin American and Caribbean (LAC) small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs). Through two facilities totaling up to US\$100 million in financing, the partners will support European Union (EU)-based firms with foreign direct investment in LAC, LAC businesses trading with the EU, European SMEs with trade ties or a presence in LAC, and internationalizing LAC SMEs. The Facility was announced at "Lateinamerika Tag", Germany's most significant event for celebrating economic ties to LAC.

## The UK's DFID Commits GBP£10 Million to Improving Citizen Security in Jamaica

The Department for International Development (DFID) of the United Kingdom has committed GB£10 million to support the "Citizen Security and Justice Programme III" in Jamaica. Led by the IDB and the Government of Jamaica, the program enhances citizen security and justice in target communities by promoting peaceful culture, improving employability and labor market attachment, and community justice services. This is DFID's third contribution in this sector, with an initial grant of GB£750,000 for the "Support for the Expansion of the Citizen Security and Justice Program II" in Jamaica in 2010, and an additional grant for GB£7.25 Million in 2012.



#### Switzerland Gives Haiti's Coffee Growers a Leg Up

Though Haiti's cocoa sector employs about 20,000 smallholder producers, most of these producers live below the poverty line due to low yields and quality, limited technical knowledge, and other obstacles. As a result, **the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC)** contributed more than US\$1 million to a US\$6 million initiative, joining the IDB's MIF, **Catholic Relief Services**, and various partners in the Haitian cocoa industry to help small-scale farmers expand into global supply chains. Ultimately, the partners aim to catalyze change by enhancing production, quality, and the capacity of farmer cooperatives.

### Nestlé Dominican Republic, ADOPEM, and the IDB Bring Business Opportunities to Women in the DR

**Nestlé Dominican Republic (DR) and ADOPEM Savings and Credit Bank** teamed up with the IDB's Multilateral Investment Fund (MIF) on a microfranchise model benefiting low-income women in the DR. The partners will expand an inclusive distribution model initially developed by Nestlé DR to market its products in low-income communities. Working through a micro franchise-based network of women from these communities and as part of Nestlé's Shared Value Creation strategy, the project will benefit 4,500 low-income women (many whom are heads of household) with traditionally limited opportunities. This is the second project within the IDB-MIF and **Citi Foundation SCALA program**.

### The Nordic Development Fund Invests in Cities and Renewable Energy

Further expanding the Nordic Development Fund (NDF)-IDB relationship, NDF representatives joined IDB President Moreno in November to sign in two new agreements. As such, the NDF will provide EUR €4 million in continued support to the Emerging and Sustainable Cities Initiative (ESCI), following up on the results of previous NDF-IDB support to midsize cities in Bolivia, Honduras and Nicaragua. Another grant of EUR €0.5 million will develop a strategy and investment plan for renewable energy in the Bay Islands in Honduras.

Deputy Prime Minister Choi Kyung Hwan of the **Government of Korea** and IDB President Moreno gathered in November to sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) formalizing Korea-IDB collaboration around the upcoming IDB Annual Meeting of the Boards of Governors. To be held in Busan, Korea at the end of March, the selection of Korea as the host country reflects the strong ties between the country and the IDB, as well as the country and the LAC region more generally.

#### The IDB Commemorates the 40th Anniversary of the Declaration of Madrid

The **Government of Spain**'s Minister for Economy and Competitiveness Luis de Guindos joined IDB President Moreno for the 40th anniversary of the Declaration of Madrid, which formalized entry of the IDB's first non-regional members. As a result, full membership was extended to 15 countries

in 1976 and 1977: Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Italy, Israel, Japan, the Netherlands, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, the United Kingdom, and the former Yugoslavia. Portugal and Norway joined in 1980 and 1986, and Croatia and Slovenia joined once Yugoslavia ceased to be a member in 1993. Later, the Republic of Korea became a member country in 2005 and the People's Republic of China became a member country in 2009. Today, the IDB has 20 non-regional members that bring experience, funding, and valued partnership to LAC.

A longstanding IDB partner, the OECD has an extensive agenda with the IDB with more than 35 ongoing joint projects and activities on wide range of topics, including statistics, sustainable development and economic policy and reform.
